

PFFF BUSKING TERMS & CONDITIONS



Successful applicants will be programmed for up to five performances of up to 30 minutes duration between 5:00pm Friday and 1:00pm Monday across the Festival weekend. The act voted most popular act will receive a paid booking at the 2020 festival. Buskers must adhere to the following terms and conditions:

1. The Port Fairy Folk Festival will provide no complimentary festival tickets or accommodation to buskers.
2. All buskers must have their own Public Liability Insurance at a minimum of at least \$10 million.
3. The best act will be voted by public popular choice. No correspondence will be entered into once the winning act has been chosen.
4. The Port Fairy Folk Festival in conjunction with the Port Fairy Business Association Stalls Coordinator is responsible for determining where buskers and street performers are allowed to perform.
5. That all performances start after 9:00am and cease by 9:00pm.
6. Busking consent agreement is valid only from 9:00am Friday 08 March 2018 until midday 11 March 2019.
7. Busking is only to be performed in designated areas.
8. Any busker under the age of 18 years is to be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian.
9. Obey any directions given to you by a member of the Victoria Police or an Authorised Council Officer (Local Laws Officer), and abide by the Moyne Shire's guidelines for busking [here](#).
10. Do not interfere with other acts that are performing at the same time.
11. Busking must not unreasonably impede free access along the footpaths and into shops.
12. Selling of merchandise, other than own original material, is not permitted.
13. That no 240v or portable amplification is used.
14. That the busker's acoustic volume is a reasonable level (ie: not of detriment to others, including performers, shopkeepers or the public).
15. That the proposed act is of a family entertainment nature.
16. That your performance will not be aggressive, dangerous or offensive to the public.
17. Buskers who do not comply with the consent guidelines will be asked to leave the street and will not be given approval in future.
18. No fire or naked flame to be used for street performances.
19. You are welcome to perform on the streets but we do expect that at all times you do what is in the best interests of others – the town, the shopkeepers, the audience, other street performers and buskers, and the PFFF.
